



### What kills more African-American children?

**Answer:** Abortion kills 1,452 black infants every day in this country. Sadly, the black community and its leaders are largely ignoring the slaughter. My name is Rev. Clenard H. Childress, Jr. I am the director of the Northeast Chapter of the Life Education And Resource Network (LEARN) and I operate the website BlackGenocide.org. I am partnering with the Center for Bio Ethical Reform (CBR) this year on some historic pro-life events and we need your help. Mark my words—our combined efforts will change the nature of the abortion debate forever. But before I elaborate on these exciting new developments please allow me to further explain the problem facing the black community on abortion.

Did you know that since 1973, more than twice as many blacks have died from abortion than from heart disease, cancer, accidents, violent crimes and AIDS combined?

Did you know that Blacks make up about 12 percent of the population in the United States but account for 37 percent of the abortions?

Abortion is Black Genocide—plain and simple!

For the past 10 years, LEARN, has co-labored with CBR on the Genocide Awareness Project (GAP) under the fine leadership of Mark Harrington. Just this winter, I, along with some teenage trainees and several seasoned veterans, defended life with CBR on the campuses of Florida State University, University of Florida, University of South Florida, and University of Central Florida in Orlando. These young people represent my vision to inspire and train a new generation of black youth to participate in pro-life activism in a similar fashion.

Our affiliation with CBR and GAP is about to reach a new level with the launch of our new long term effort - the Black Genocide Awareness Project (BGAP). We have big plans for BGAP in 2008 and beyond but we need to raise \$20,000 to help cover the expenses of some of our upcoming events. Please consider partnering with us financially.

**ACTION STEP #1**—Confront black leadership about the genocide occurring in the Afro-American community.

On July 13-18, 2008, LEARN will confront the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) at its annual national convention in Cincinnati, OH, about its unwillingness to substantively address abortion. Historically, the NAACP has failed to address the concerns of many of its delegates about abortion. In 2004, the NAACP issued a resolution voicing support for “equal access to abortion” and urged its members to participate in a pro-abortion rally in Washington, DC. In 2007, the NAACP, for the second time in four years, blocked a proposed resolution expressing opposition to abortion. The good news is the NAACP’s Macon chapter is once again poised to present another pro-life resolution at this year’s Cincinnati conference and we will be there to support them.

By utilizing CBR’s GAP display, “Choice” billboard trucks, and airplane tow banners we will expose delegates to the reality of black genocide. Displaying horrifying abortion images at this year’s convention we hope to force the plight of black babies onto the NAACP’s agenda for the first time.

- Driving trucks displaying gigantic abortion images so commuters and pedestrians can see the truth.
- Circling the convention center and greater Cincinnati with an airplane tow banner confronting the NAACP’s apathy towards the devastation that abortion has brought to the black community.

Afro-American leader, Rev. Jesse Jackson, was once an advocate for the pre-born. He wrote an article published in a 1977 National Right to Life Committee News that read:

"What happens to the mind of a person, and the moral fabric of a nation, that accepts the aborting of the life of a baby without a pang of conscience? What kind of a person and what kind of a society will we have twenty years hence if life can be taken so casually? It is that question, the question of our attitude, our value system, and our mind-set with regard to the nature and worth of life itself that is the central question confronting mankind. Failure to answer that question affirmatively may leave us with a hell right here on earth."

Sadly, like Jackson, so many of America's black leaders have sold out to the abortion industry and the black community is now facing "hell on earth." But we have an opportunity at the NAACP convention to remind these leaders of our real value system. Because 2008 is an election year, the Presidential candidates will undoubtedly speak at the convention. This gives us a national stage to make our case to the American people, as a whole, as well as the convention delegates.

Whether you are black or white, we know that the black community and its leadership hold the key to turning the abortion debate around. If my fellow black leaders begin to address the issue—Roe v. Wade's days are numbered.

**ACTION STEP #2— Visit Historically Black Colleges and Universities with the Genocide Awareness Project (GAP)**

Revelations of eugenic ideology and the racist practices of Planned Parenthood are unfolding more and more. Planned Parenthood was recently exposed for receiving donations given specifically to single out minority babies for abortion. Planned Parenthood has diabolically perpetrated their murderous plot to surgically eliminate those they deem undesirable. Margaret Sanger, founder of Planned Parenthood, referred to blacks as "human weeds." In her infamous "Negro Project" she opined:

*We should hire three or four colored ministers, preferably with social service backgrounds, and with engaging personalities. The most successful educational approach to the Negro is through a religious appeal. We don't want the word to go out that we want to exterminate the Negro population and the minister is the man who can straighten out that idea if it ever occurs to any of their more rebellious members."*

Many black ministers and leaders have followed the murderous path that Sanger envisioned long ago. Starting today, that is all about to change. With your assistance we can make history!

The 2008 presidential campaign has opened the door for conversations about race. However, few black leaders are willing to discuss the racism of Planned Parenthood. We are going to take the message of black genocide to black academia. CBR and LEARN are ready to use GAP to expose Planned Parenthood at historically Black colleges. God willing, the first target for BGAP is the prestigious black college of Florida A&M this fall! Pray for us.
